There are five rules which govern the pronunciation of words when they are spoken as part of an utterance in the English language.

These five rules are:

- 1. Catenation (consonant \rightarrow vowel)
 - e.g. Why don't you come over tonight?

come.móver

2. Assimilation (consonant \rightarrow consonant)

e.g. Wear your light blue dress for the party tonight.

lighp.blue

3. Intrusion (vowel \rightarrow vowel)

e.g. Let's see, Matt and me and Mary makes three for dinner.

Matt.tánd me.y.ánd

4. Weakening

e.g. What would you do if the police arrested you?

yu thu yu

5. Elision

e.g. You shouldn't wear white trainers to a job interview.

whi.trainers
